**Jerome D. Schein, Ph.D. FAPA**, Professor Emeritus New York University and Adjunct Professor University of Alberta, co-author of AIM, passed away on April 16, 2010. Dr. Schein was an international authority on Sensory Rehabilitation, Deafness and Deafness Studies, Deafblindness, Demography and Literacy. He was the only person to have held both of the only two endowed chairs of Deafness Research in the world - the P.V. Doctor Chair of Deafness Research at Gallaudet University and the David Peikoff Chair of Deafness Studies at the University of Alberta (Canada). He published 25 books and more than 200 refereed papers on sensory disorders and received numerous honors and awards. His final book *Hearing Disorders Handbook* with Professor Maurice H. Miller was published in 2008.
